Dr. Coppola directs the

Language Creation Laboratory and the Study of
Language and Math and advocates for equal access
to graduate and post-graduate training for Deaf
scholars in the US. Her investigations have led her to
study the impact of language experience on number
concepts and social cognition in deaf children. Her
experience as the daughter of Deaf parents makes
her research possible and motivates her national and
international advocacy.
